



Who were the Anglo-Saxons?

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> The Anglo Saxons were a mix of tribes from Germany, Denmark and the Netherlands. The three biggest were the Angles, the Saxons and the Jutes. When the Romans left Britain (410AD), the Anglo Saxons successfully invaded England. They settled in the eastern parts of Britain and created seven kingdoms. Many Anglo Saxons came to find land to farm as their homelands in Scandinavia often flooded so it was difficult to grow food there. The Anglo Saxons didn't like the stone houses and roads from the Romans so they built their own villages and made their houses from wattle and daub. The most common occupation was farming. Boys learnt their fathers' farming skills while girls worked in the home. Very few children learnt to read and write. 	<p>Anglo Saxon migration</p>  <p>The map shows the British Isles with arrows indicating migration routes. 	<p>Invasion</p> <p>The act of an army entering another country by force in order to take control of it.</p>	
	<p>Kingdom</p> <p>A country, state or territory ruled by a king or queen.</p>	
<p>Settlement</p> <p>Places where people live and sometimes work.</p>
