
# Who were the Anglo-Saxons?

### Key knowledge (Fab 5)


- The Anglo Saxons were a mix of tribes from Germany, Denmark and the Netherlands. The three biggest were the Angles, the Saxons and the Jutes.
- When the Romans left Britain (410AD), the Anglo Saxons successfully invaded England. They settled in the eastern parts of Britain and created seven kingdoms.
- Many Anglo Saxons came to find land to farm as their homelands in Scandinavia often flooded so it was difficult to grow food there.
- 4. The Anglo Saxons didn't like the stone houses and roads from the Romans so they built their own villages and made their houses from wattle and daub.
- 5. The most common occupation was farming. Boys learnt their fathers' farming skills while girls worked in the home. Very few children learnt to read and write.
